## CJTT LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The idea of Tri Town Foundation came from some Americans who had moved to the area, and spoke of the community foundation in their town in Ohio and the benefit it gives to that community and its residents. The first discussion was over a beer at Roosters; then Murray Cooper and Peter Ramsay attended a Community Foundations of Canada conference to learn more. While there, they were given the services of a consultant who told them that our population was too small and not wealthy enough to support a community foundation. Undeterred, a group of people\* sat down and approved the idea, each putting up \$100 for expenses to get started. In the beginning that was all the funds available to give to local charities, which in 1995 amounted to \$2,000. Foundation directors still give a donation (now \$150) per year, today it is used for administration costs. A big boost came from the first Frog's Breath fundraiser, when over half a million dollars was received to support the Temiskaming Music Festival, Temiskaming Art Gallery and the Classic Theatre. Today, the foundation has over 3 million dollars invested, and income of over \$100,000 per year is given to local charities and non profit organizations to support their activities. The original board of 7 who are being honoured with the Life Time Achievement Award has grown to 12 to better cover the South Temiskaming Area. Tri Town Foundation was incorporated on February 25 1994, and after it expanded to cover more than the Tri Towns, changed its name to The Temiskaming Foundation in 2009.
